

Emergency Disaster Kits for Pets



If you are making a disaster kit for your family be sure to include your four legged family members in your planning.

A Pet Kit should include at a minimum

- A leash
 - Even if your pet never uses one you may need to keep them close at hand, on the road, at a shelter or in a vehicle.
 - A crate is another option but you will already be carrying your supplies.
- An unbreakable bowl
- Food and water for 3 days
 - Double bag your supply in a plastic zip lock bag
 - Include your pets needs when storing your families water supply
 - If you are packing canned food be sure to include a manual can opener
 - Include a favorite treat, an emergency is stressful for pets too
- Blanket or towel for sleeping and warmth



- Be sure your pets ID tags are up to date and consider getting a chip implanted by your vet in case you are separated during a disaster
- Preload your veterinarians phone number a local emergency veterinary clinic and area shelters into your phone.



- Place this all into a small backpack, store it near your other disaster supplies so that you can grab and go if necessary.
